Names First Executive Director
October 11, 2004**



Walter T. Marlowe, P.E., CAE was selected as the first executive director of the American Academy of Water Resources Engineers at the October 9, 2004 meeting of the Academy's Board of Direction in Denver, CO.

"He brings a wealth of leadership and managerial talents to our organization as we look to deliver value to our Diplomates and promote professionalism at its highest level."

Mr. Marlowe also serves as the Director, Professional Practice of the American Society of Civil Engineers, where he is responsible for managing the professional activities of the Society. He is involved with diverse issues such as: ethics; licensure; career development; continuing professional development; management and leadership training; and the Order of the Engineer.

Mr. Marlowe previously managed the ASCE International Department that supports over 14,000 internationally-based ASCE members, 10 International Sections, 19 International Groups, 65 Agreements of Cooperation and 3 multilateral accords. He also served as the Content Manager for CE World: ASCE's First Virtual Congress for Civil Engineering that debuted in July 2002.

Mr. Marlowe began his association management career at ASCE in 1991 as Manager, Technical Activities in the New York City office. He further served as the Director, Technical Activities overseeing 22 technical divisions and councils immediately after the transition from New York to Reston, Va. from 1996 to 1998.

Prior to re-joining ASCE in 2001, Mr. Marlowe served as the Associate Executive Director of the National Society of Professional Engineers in Alexandria, Va. In that role, he lead several Society operations re-engineering projects and spearheaded a new database implementation project.

Mr. Marlowe is an alumnus of Stevens Institute of Technology in Hoboken, NJ where he earned a Bachelor of Engineering (Civil) degree. He also holds a Masters of Business Administration degree from the George Washington University in Washington, DC. Mr. Marlowe is a licensed professional engineer in New Jersey and New York. He also holds the Certified Association Executive (CAE) credential from the American Society of Association Executives.
